Please take note of critical dates such as the return date for Early Registration forms. Please feel free to make duplicate copies of these forms and this booklet for your participating Adult Scouters and Scouts and have them filled out, signed and ready for inspection at check-in.

Check-in and campsite assignments will begin at 5:00pm on Friday, April 16th. Please plan to attend the Cracker Barrel and Leader’s Meeting for all Scoutmasters and SPL’s as well as Venture Crew Advisors and Youth Crew Leaders at 10:00pm where any last minute changes to the program schedule will be discussed. ***You will want to attend the Friday evening program!***

Our staff has developed an exciting, explosive, outstanding Campfire program, including an Order of the Arrow Ceremony and Call-out!

General Information



1. MEMBERSHIP

All participants of the Camporee must be registered members of the Boy Scouts of America. All Southern Sky District Boy Scouts, Varsity, and Venture Patrol Scouts should attend this annual spring CAMPING event. The Troop Scoutmaster or SPL shall present a roster at check-in of all scouts attending.

Troops participating in this Camporee will need to have their Scouts divided into patrols with a minimum of 6 and a maximum of 12 Scouts per patrol. Webelos Scouts may participate in the Camporee subject to the following conditions:

- Each Webelos Den must participate with a registered Boy Scout Troop.
- Webelos Scouts are members of a Boy Scout Patrol and may compete with that patrol
- All Webelos Scouts must be in full uniform (Webelos Shirt, Scout pants, socks, etc.).

2. TWO-DEEP LEADERSHIP

All units attending the Camporee must comply with the BSA policy requiring that “two registered adult leaders or adult and a parent of a participating Scout, one of whom must be at least 21 years of age or older, are required for all trips and outings”.

3. SITE LOCATION

The James Ray Scout Reservation is located on Lake Texoma near Pottsboro, Texas. This 540 acre camp offers camping, hiking, canoeing, sailing, rifle, shotgun and archery ranges, swimming, and 12 year round campsites. Lake Texoma is famous for sand bass and stripers. The several miles of shoreline on Camp James Ray provide some great fishing. Remember to bring your fishing gear.

From Dallas take US 75 north to exit 69 (Hwy 120), turn west and follow Hwy 120 to Pottsboro and proceed straight west on FM 996. Follow FM 996 paved road past the church on the right. About ½ mile past the church take Locust Road left, proceed to Locust Grocery and turn right on Mill Creek Road. Follow paved road past Camp Texoma and the Girl Scout Camp. The camp entrance is on the right just past Mill Creek Resort Road. There is a map included with this packet.

4. ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES/TOBACCO PRODUCTS

Alcoholic beverages and tobacco are NOT permitted at a Scouting function. Anyone found possessing or consuming alcoholic beverages will be required to leave the Camp. The use of any tobacco product is discouraged at any time at a BSA event.

5. NON-SCOUTING EQUIPMENT

Guns, sheath knives and other such equipment not accepted by Scouting are prohibited. Any equipment of this kind will be confiscated and returned to adult leader upon check-out. Fireworks are prohibited as well. Camouflaged clothing is not appropriate for Scout functions as per BSA policy. Please leave your personal electronic entertainment (iPods, CD players, MP3, cell phones, etc.) at home so everyone can enjoy the outdoor experience peacefully.

6. CRITTERS AND PLANTS

Be prepared to defend yourselves against mosquitoes, chiggers, and ticks. Be careful to avoid any fire ants, snakes and poison ivy. Bring your personal first aid kits for temporary treatment. All Troops should have a large, properly labeled and visible First Aid kit available in their campsites at all times during the Camporee.

7. WEATHER

Everyone must be fully prepared for variable weather conditions at this time of year. Temperature ranges over the weekends could be quite cold to quite warm (this is Texas!). Scouts are encouraged to bring the necessary layers of clothing to be as comfortable as possible at both of these extremes. Appropriate personal rain protection is also an excellent idea, as it has been known to (occasionally) rain during Scouting events in the past. To help with this, we will prepare a *“Weather Rock”* station to forecast the weather!

8. FIRST AID

There will be a First Aid station staffed 24 hours per day for any Scout or Scouter needing assistance. The First Aid Station will be centrally located and marked with a Red Cross Flag. Please be sure to advise your patrol members of its location, to be announced at Friday’s Cracker Barrel and the Saturday morning Flag ceremony.

REGISTRATION

1. CHECK-IN

Check-in will begin at 5:00pm on Friday, April 16th for normal arrival and at 7:00am on Saturday for late arrivals. The Scoutmaster/SPL must present the completed Consent to Treat and Troop Rosters and pay any outstanding fees at this time. Check in will be at the entry gate on Friday. Late check in will be at the camp Headquarters building. If you plan to leave early (prior to Sunday), please notify camp staff at check-in.

2. CONSENT TO TREAT FORMS

The Troop Leader must have a Medical Record for each Scout participating in this Camporee. A copy of this form may be downloaded and may be examined by our Health and Safety Officer at check-in. There is a new form for the medical and the entire completed form is required. These forms must be kept in the Troop/Patrol area throughout the Camporee and available during the Campfire Inspection. (Form can be found at www.scouting.org/forms)

3. CHECK-OUT

Final check-out for everyone is to begin at 10:00am Sunday. Those not staying Saturday night must check out with the Camporee Staff after 5:00pm on Saturday. In either case, your Camporee Inspection and Camporee Evaluation forms must be completed and returned before you receive your patches and check-out packet.



4. CAMPOREE EVALUATION

Please fill out the included Camporee Evaluation and return it at check-out. Be fair and honest in your opinions as they will have a bearing on future Camporees. All suggestions or improvement are greatly appreciated.

5. TOUR PERMITS

Because this Camporee is a District event but is being held on BSA property, a Local Tour Permit is not required.

6. REGISTRATION FEES

Each Scout, Team Member, Venturer, and Adult Scouter will be charged a registration fee of \$12.00 to participate in the Camporee. The Units who register for the event on or before the April 11th date will receive \$2.00 discount for each Scout and Scouter!!



The fee covers the costs for event insurance, a Camporee patch, supplies for the events and administration costs (cracker barrel, supplies, port-potties, etc.). If registering by mail, the postmark date will be used as the registration date.

CAMPING

1. CAMPSITES

Each Troop will be assigned a campsite adequate for the number of Scouts indicated on your Troop Registration form. Last minute additions to your Troop Roster may result in overcrowding of campsites so please have an accurate attendance count for Registration. Be reminded to have a First Aid Kit, trash bags, Patrol Duty Roster, Meal Planner, Troop Duty Roster and Consent to Treat forms visible in your campsite.



2. COOKING AND SANITATION

Each Patrol will cook by the Patrol Method, and must furnish its own food, ice, stove fuel, wood or charcoal. There is a single campfire ring in each camp site so you must be prepared to cook off the ground as no campfire or cooking fires may be built directly on the ground. **ABSOLUTELY NO GROUND FIRES OUTSIDE OF THE FIRE RINGS.**

All Patrols/Teams/Dens are encouraged to use charcoal or stoves (liquid or propane). BSA rules for handling of liquid or gas fuels should be followed (*Guide to Safe Scouting*). Troops must bring their own charcoal and firewood.

3. GARBAGE

No large dumpsters will be available and all garbage and trash are to be taken out with you. Troops are asked to provide a final count of non-recyclable pieces of trash at check out as part of our Zero Waste campaign.

4. CAMPSITE INSPECTION

Each campsite will be inspected and rated during daylight hours on Saturday between the hours of 10am and 12 noon. A check list for this inspection is included in this packet. Points will count on both the Top Troop and Top Patrol Awards. We will use BSA's Low Impact Camping Guidelines.

5. FIRE SAFETY

Each patrol is to provide its own chemical fire extinguisher per Patrol and/or Troop cooking area. You do not need cans of dirt or water available.

6. WATER

Abundant fresh water is available at Camp James Ray. All Troops should bring their own water containers to transport the water to their campsites as needed.

7. VEHICLES AND PARKING

No motorized vehicles other than the Troop trailer are to be parked in the campsites at any time. Good road access will allow all equipment to be unloaded as quickly as possible at the campsite, and the vehicles moved to the designated parking area to allow everyone a chance to approach their campsite. Unauthorized vehicles will be towed.

Only properly marked Staff or Handicapped vehicles will be permitted in camp.

PROGRAM EVENTS

Scout Programs

The 2010 Spring Camporee will be held at the James Ray Scout Reservation, April 16th – 20th, 2010. We will concentrate on basic scout skills and fun activities throughout the day with at least 10 stations for the scouts to stop and enjoy. At each station a different Scout will be the patrol leader, and he will be the only scout giving commands or doing any talking during the event. Each event is timed and has certain criteria that a patrol will have to accomplish to make the total of 20 points per station. The First year scouts will go to the Scout Skills area during certain stations and rejoin their patrol after they have completed their challenge.

Special Events

Patrol Flag Judging:

All patrols are encouraged to carry their patrol flag with them during the morning and afternoon events and to cheer loudly. Each patrol wishing to enter their flag for judging must have a patrol member bring their flag to the Camporee HQ (Dining Hall) when finished with the morning events. Flags must be reviewed before 1:00pm Saturday. Visual appeal is important; every patrol flag must contain the Troop number, Patrol name, and either “BSA” or a fleur-de-lis. Ribbons will be awarded to the top three patrol flags!

Afternoon Events:

Pickle Eating Contest Let’s find out who can eat the pickle the fastest with their hands behind their back!

Blind Tent Setup: Competition between patrols

Saturday Cracker Barrel International Dutch Oven Cook-off

This year’s Saturday night cracker barrel will be an opportunity for all units to demonstrate their international dutch oven recipes. Scouts should bring their mess kits Your Camporee staff will provide drinks and their own special treats to compliment this cracker barrel, but it will be up to the Troops to make it memorable! You may cook a desert or a main course dish, it is up to you!

We will have a registration for all units to fill in at check-in on Friday night. This should be completed and turned into Camporee HQ by 6:00 pm on Saturday to be eligible for prizes.

LEADER INFORMATION



A. LEADER MEETING

The designated Adult and Scout Leaders at your campsite (preferably the Scoutmaster and SPL) must attend the **Leader Meeting at the cracker barrel at 10:00pm on Friday.** At that time, any questions on check-in materials received or on the schedule of activities may be discussed. Additional information on activities or schedule changes will also be presented at that time.

B. OPENING

We will have an opening ceremony including flag raising and invocation at 9:00am on Saturday. In keeping with our theme, we are asking that every Troop carry their American, Troop and Patrol flags to this ceremony.

C. SKIT AUDITIONS

Auditions for Patrols wishing to present a Scout appropriate skit and/or song at the Campfire will be at the Leadership Corps starting at 4:30pm Saturday. Troops who participate will earn points that will help them in the Top Troop competition! We are looking for adult Scouter skits also! Come if you dare to compete with the Camporee Staff skit!!

D. MAIN CAMPFIRE

We anticipate another spectacular, outstanding, explosive, dynamic campfire Saturday evening. Live music, loudspeakers, and microphones – it will be loud! The Waka Tanka Chapter of the Mikinakawa Lodge of the Order of the Arrow will be there in full regalia, and an OA Guide will lead Scouts to the campfire for the opening. There will also be plenty of skits and songs, so bring a chair and be prepared for a good time! We will present some awards on Saturday night and continue on Sunday after our morning services.



E. AWARDS

Ribbons will be awarded for all Troops and Patrols attending and participating at the Camporee. Ribbons will be awarded for all events based on how well they complete their skills as a Patrol as well as Patrol spirit, with 1st, 2nd and 3rd places for each stop or event. We will also have 1st, 2nd and 3rd place ribbons for TOP TROOP AND TOP PATROLS!

Early departures will receive their awards at the May Roundtable!

F. ADULT PROGRAM

There will be opportunities to train your new Adult Scouters also! An adult Tomahawk throw, horseshoe competition and other events will also make this weekend something to remember!



G. SUNDAY SERVICE

Religious services will be held Sunday morning at 8:45 am. We will have a printed program for you to take home to use as guidelines for your own Troop's Sunday services.

Please come, it is important we leave the Camporee with thanks that we have had the opportunity to participate and to experience the fellowship of Camporee camping.

H. TRADING POST

The Camporee Trading Post will be set up at the main pavilion. We will have old patches to sell or trade and don't forget Sunday's Wooden Nickel redemption. The Scouts who collected the Camporee Wooden Commemorative Nickels can exchange them for fun and goofy scout prizes immediately after the Scouts Own Service on Sunday!

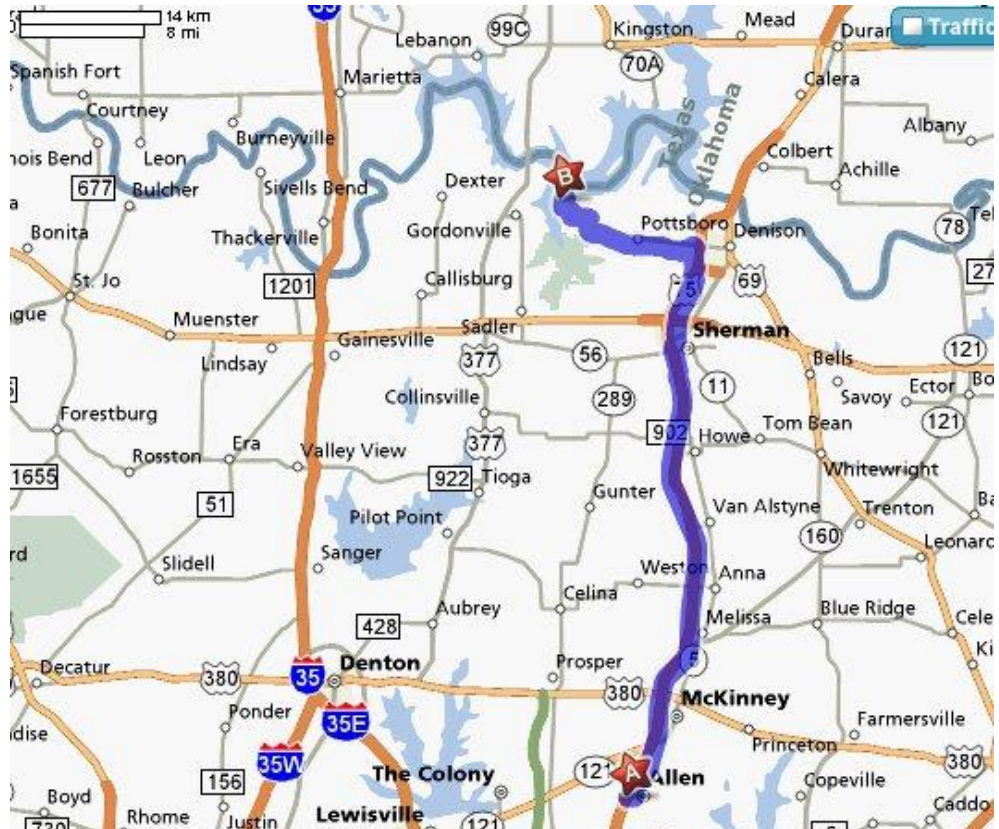

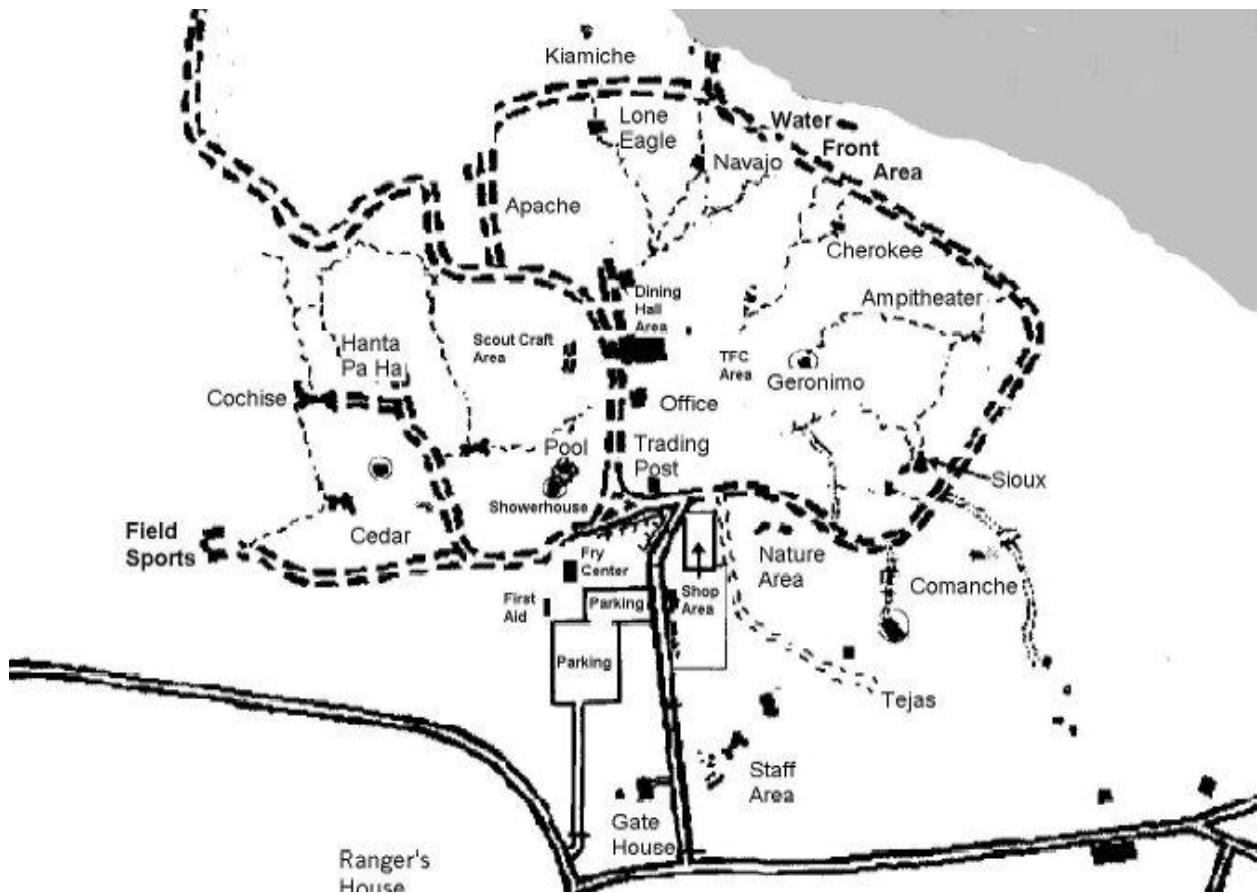
