Welcome to the brand new, super exciting, Webelos Outdoor Weekend (WOW) event! WOW will be held from Friday September 25th through Sunday, September 27th at Camp James Ray in Pottsboro, TX.

Thanks for your interest in helping the Webelos have a fun and successful weekend. This is a great opportunity for your troop to recruit while giving back to the Scouting program.

We want to make sure you are informed about your troop's role in the event. Here is some information that should be helpful:

- Each troop will be expected to participate in the Saturday evening cracker barrel. The cracker barrel will be a cooking contest for the troops judged by the Webelos. Keeping in mind that many people have food allergies, please provide a list of ingredients with your dish for anyone that needs to know if they should eat your item.
- Each troop will also be responsible for an activity during the day on Saturday. The troop's responsibility for the activity will include planning, staffing, and any materials or equipment needed for the activity. The activity should be highly interactive, age-appropriate for Webelos Scouts, and some kind of measurement for scoring dens competitively.
- The camping area will be set up ahead of time by district. When you arrive at Camp James Ray, please check in with our staff to locate your camp area. Set up camp quickly so you can look your best for the Webelos. This year, we are encouraging the Webelos Dens to arrive on Friday night and to visit each troop's campsite.
- Please bring any appropriate decorations, displays, and items to show off your troop. This may be pictures from summer camp, high adventure activities, or campouts, or awards, ribbons, gateways, etc. This event is intended to help you recruit, so make a big deal about yourselves!

WOW Competition Activity Choices

Each participating troop is asked to choose, prepare, and run an activity on Saturday of the event. Activities will run about 20 minutes and will be spread around Camp James Ray. Each activity should be prepared to host 2-4 dens, or about 32 boys, at a time.

The focus of the activities is on outdoor skills and fun, however, there should be some element of competition and, if possible, a Webelos pin requirement. The activity your troop chooses should be age-appropriate for 10-11 year old boys and should be easily instructed by the boys in your troop. Remember KISMIF: Keep it Simple, Make it Fun!

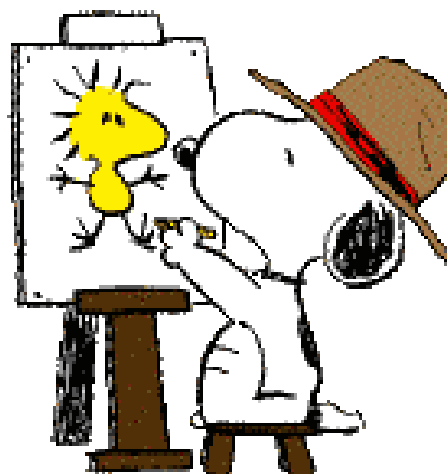
